


The Value of Prophecy

 - Political leader in London
- In 1855 he visited Israel and purchased a plot of land, it was the first land owned by a Jew in 1200 years.

Land of Israel & the Bible

1. 75% of the Bible speaks of Israel.
2. Israel is mentioned nearly 2,000 times in the Bible.
3. “Jerusalem” is mentioned over 800 times in the Bible. Israel is described as “My Land” 144 times.
4. The Land of Israel is called “My Land”, “Glory of all Lands”, “Land which I Care For”, “Beautiful land.”





The Dispersions & “Re-gatherings” of Israel

- 1. Israel entered the land under Joshua**
- 2. Dispersion under the Assyrian and Babylonian Captivities.**
- 3. Return to the Land under Zerubbabel,
Ezra, & Nehemiah(445 B.C.)**
- 4. Dispersion after AD 70 and Roman
General Titus**
- 5. Israel Becomes a Nation - May 14, 1948**

Two End-Time Re-Gatherings

- 1 . In unbelief prior to the Tribulation**
- 2. In belief prior to the Millennium**

Gathered in Unbelief

700 B.C.

Zephaniah 2:1

“Gather yourselves together, yea, gather together, O nation not desired...before the fierce anger of the Lord come upon you...before the day of the Lord's anger come upon you...”

A term referring to the Tribulation period

Zechariah 10:10

Gathered in Belief

600 B.C.

- “I will bring them again also out of the Egypt, and gather them out of Assyria, and bring them into Gilead and Lebanon...”(10:10)
- “I will bring them, and they shall dwell in the midst of Jerusalem and they shall be my people, and I shall be their God, in truth and righteousness.”(Zech. 8:8)

End-times Regathering Chart

First Regathering (Present)	Final Regathering (Permanent)
World-Wide	World-Wide
Return to Part of the Land	Return to all the Land
Return in Unbelief	Return in Faith
Restored to the Land Only	Restored to the Land and to the Lord
Sets the stage for Discipline (Tribulation)	Sets the stage for blessing (Millennium)

Isaiah 11:11-12

Regathering

1. Israel Re-gathering in Belief - Before Millennium

Isaiah 11:11-12 “And it shall come to pass in that day, [that] the Lord shall set his hand again the second time to recover the remnant of his people, which shall be left, from Assyria, and from Egypt, and from Pathros, and from Cush, and from Elam, and from Shinar, and from Hamath, and from the islands of the sea. And he shall set up an ensign for the nations, and shall assemble the outcasts of Israel, and gather together the dispersed of Judah from the four corners of the earth.

1. This is the second “end-time” regathering.

2. The is a “world-wide” regathering.

The return from Assyria and Babylon are not pictured here because they were not “world-wide”.

Modern-Day Return to the Land

FIRST WAVE - 1949-1950 - “Operation Magic Carpet”
49,000 Yemenite Jews. In a secret operation 380 flights using British and US transport planes.

SECOND WAVE - from Western Europe, especially Germany

THIRD WAVE - One million Jews came from Russia in 1980s and 1990s

FOURTH WAVE - came from Ethiopia

Conclusion: Israel

“God will not cast away his people” (Romans 11).

The regathering to the land in 1948 is a fulfillment of a promise.

Joshua 21:43-45

- “So the Lord gave Israel all the land which He had sworn to give to their fathers, and they possessed and lived in it. And the Lord gave them rest on every side, according to all that He had sworn to their fathers, none of their enemies stood before them; the Lord gave all their enemies into their hand. No one of the good promises, which the Lord had made to the house of Israel had failed; all came to pass.”

How Should We Interpret Joshua 21:43-45?

- A Testimony to God's Faithfulness!
- Joshua 21:43-45 must be understood within the overall context of the entire book of Joshua, not as a proof text. The broad context is that Israel was only partially true to their charge, while God was unconditionally faithful to His Word.

Prophetic Promises

- 1. The land promises to Israel are everlasting.
- 2. The land promises to Israel are future
- 3. The land promises to Israel are stated throughout the Old Testament.
- Amos 9:14-15 - “Also I will restore the captivity of My people Israel; and they will rebuild the ruined cities and live in them...’I will also plant them on their land, and they will not be rooted out from their land which I have given them’, says the Lord your God.’



**Commentary on Joshua

Replacement Theology

- “God is finished with Israel, and has replaced Israel as a people with the church.”
- “We believe that the church is essentially Israel. We believe that the answer to, “What about the Jews?” is, “Here we are.” There, we are again one people. In His holy and heavenly temple there is neither Jew nor Greek, male nor female,... There, we are all together, the Israel of God, princes with God.”
